IPECP and patient safety in the light of the Corona pandemic

A highly relevant topic to many of us that will focus on the necessary changes to student clinical placements and education practices in relation to the Corona pandemic outbreak in 2019/2020.

Human rights and IPECP

Human rights place the patient in focus and promote the interprofessional team to listen to the voice of the patient. Consequently, challenges in our society bring failure to maintain human rights to the surface. Debated subjects are e.g. the discrimination of elderly patients, patients cared for forensic psychiatry and patients with an immigration background. This topic about human rights and IPECP ask questions regarding how we include the patient in our education and clinical practice.

Internationalization abroad or at home – sustainability?

Could IPECP be the catalyzer for a more sustainable practice promoting both cultural awareness and patient safety?

Didactics in IPE

This topic is about how to teach IPE with focus on patient safety. Digital development within the area have been an important factor, both recently and previously, along with a big progress and demand within the interprofessional simulation based education. What competencies are assessed and what criteria are used? Is the student assessed with a progression focus?

Framework

The theoretical framework around interprofessional collaborative practice is widely discussed. Different aspects can be contextually bound to a clinical setting and academic environment. The theoretical explanations of framework can vary, due to cultural and historical factors from around the world and thus IPECP can be viewed differently.
